Auction 2006 Reaches £4,000

The ever-popular Annual Auction was held in Child Okeford Village Hall on Saturday 23rd June 2006 and once again proved what a great team of volunteers we have and how all their hard work can pay off.

As soon as the Auctioneer's gavel had hit for the last time in July 2005 Gordon Adam OBE was already making plans for this year's event.

During the extensive amount of time Gordon spends working in the two charity shops he is able to source a huge variety of goods of greater value or that will attract more interest if presented at the Auction rather than on sale in the shops. The Auction's reputation locally means we are also lucky enough to have items donated specifically for the event and this year we had 219 lots.

Our team of volunteers help throughout the year collecting donated goods and transporting the vast amounts to our store in Sturminster Newton. Gordon collates all the goods into lots and prepares an extensive catalogue for us to publish and sell prior to the event. This always raises interest amongst local dealers.

On the Friday afternoon prior to the Auction the large team have to move all the lots to the hall in Child Okeford. Not only does this involve several trips in the Friends van but also a horsebox, an assortment of cars and several trailers. We must have raised plenty of interest as we were preparing our convoy in the centre of Sturminster Newton. Ready to meet us in Child Okeford was the second part of the team tasked with arranging everything to correspond to the catalogue. And what a job that was!

Saturday morning we were all "up with the lark". Even more members of the team then became involved as clerks, stewards, car parking attendants and thank goodness for the ladies providing the refreshments! We certainly needed our early morning cuppa.

The hall soon filled and when the Auction got under way Gordon kept the bids coming until the gavel fell for the final time.

Out of the £4000 made expenses were kept to a minimum and the net proceeds of £3772 will certainly be put to good use. A huge thank you must go out to Gordon and the team of volunteers that helped in so many ways to make this event such a success.

A message from our Chairman, Peter Fale

Firstly, I would like to start by welcoming five new members on to the Friends Council, namely, Doc Addison, Trevor Bridle, Brian Burrows, Bob McLaren and Jackie Stayt. It is always nice to welcome new people to support the work that we do and I hope that they find the contributions that they make to this important role very satisfying. On behalf of all on Council, I welcome them and I very much look forward to working with them.

With the current changes taking place nationally to the NHS and the forthcoming merger of the three existing Primary Care Trusts in Dorset, we are living in uncertain times. It is therefore, important that we are clear as to how we would hope that things develop with respect to our local hospital. The guiding principle is that a community hospital should enable people to avoid the need to attend an appointment, or to stay unnecessarily in a general hospital. Thus providing care and treatment as close to their home as possible. With this in mind, the question that needs addressing is what specific services should be provided by Blandford Hospital in the next five years or so.

Currently the hospital provides care for both physical and mental health, care of the elderly and palliative care for terminally ill patients. At the moment Joseph Weld Hospice is the nearest hospice facility for people living in and around the Blandford area. The Primary Care Trust are exploring the idea of increasing the palliative care facilities at Blandford Hospital, thus enhancing the already excellent service that is currently provided for those using the Family Room on Portman Ward – which you may be aware, was provided by the Friends. Personally, I would like to see some exploration of the possibility of there being continuing care beds, as at the moment provision for those in need of 24 hour care either by the NHS or Social Services is woefully inadequate and residential accommodation is in very short supply.

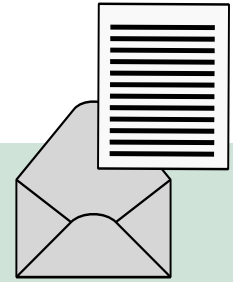
Another important way in which the hospital can contribute to the health care of the community, in partnership with GPs, is the management of long-term conditions such as diabetes. Therefore all services are being reviewed to enable patients who need regular treatment to be able to have this treatment at Blandford, rather than having to travel to an acute hospital elsewhere. Obviously the wider the range of clinics available, the greater the number of patients can be treated locally and we at the Friends feel this is something of great importance to patients and their families. The Community Mental Health Team continues to operate from Blandford Hospital and provide an excellent service.

I am aware that many value the Theatre facility at Blandford and recently a great deal of thought has been given as to the best use that can be made of it given to the more stringent health and safety regulations that are now in place. Apart from low risk surgery, the use of the Theatre for diagnostics seems an appropriate development and one that the hospital is ideally suited for.

The Friends continue to strive to support and enhance the facilities at Blandford Hospital and I would welcome letters from any of our members who wish to comment on the treatment they have received. As always, we continue to look for new members who feel they can support us in any way and if you have a relative, friend or neighbour who you feel may be able to help, please show them this newsletter or give them our contact details. It is only with your help that we can continue to support this local community hospital in providing such a high standard of care.

I do hope that it will be possible for Jean to continue to expand these sessions, and that all volunteers will be able to find the time to attend, as they can only enhance the 'job satisfaction' I am sure we all feel.

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Matron's Update

As you may be aware the NHS is undergoing a period of change at the moment and North Dorset Primary Care Trust which currently oversees Blandford Hospital is due to merge with the other two Primary Care Trusts in Dorset. The merge will mean that there is one Primary Care Trust for Dorset and this will come in to effect from 1st October 2006. The new Trust will become Dorset Primary Care Trust. With this in mind, we are currently reviewing all our services within the hospital to ensure quality and cost effectiveness. All departments are in the process of producing performance and developmental action plans.

'A Vision for Community Hospitals'

Meetings have been taking place to discuss future hospital developments in relation to palliative/hospice care (for terminally ill people), the operating theatre, long term care, intermediate care and integrated older people services. The Director of Primary and Community Services is producing a paper to

reflect the meetings and to look at the way forward for future developments in North Dorset. The Trust Board will meet in September to discuss this.

Integrated Older Peoples Services

Representatives from both mental health and physical health services have been meeting to discuss a more integrated way of working. The Integrated Older Peoples Service will benefit patients in terms of staff being able to assess both physical and psychological conditions.

The Minor Injuries Unit at Blandford Hospital is now open from 0800-2000 hours.

During this period of change, I am reassured in the knowledge that we have such a good team here at Blandford Hospital, that the usual high standard of care and treatment will continue to be provided.

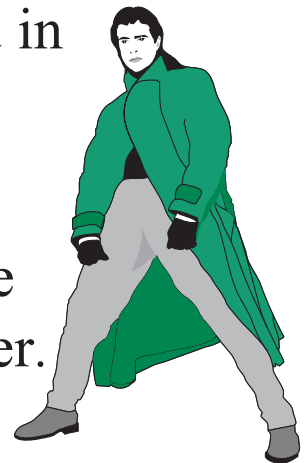

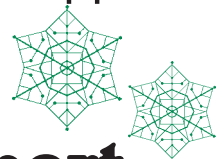
